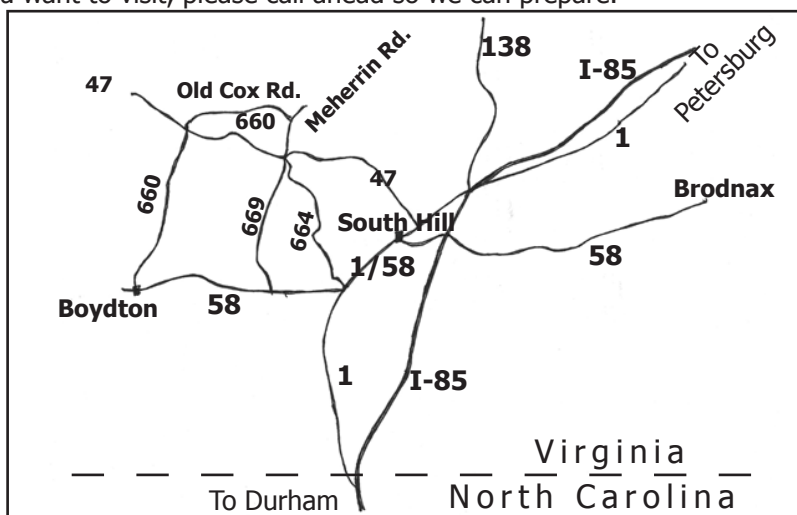

Introduction

Buckhorn Creek Nursery was a new enterprise in 2002-2003. The owners, Harry and Judy Johnson, have created a small, state-of-the-art container plant nursery in beautiful Southside Virginia to provide the horticulture and landscape industry with high quality, traditional and Xeriscape plant products. Constructed on Johnson/Smithson family land that has been in these families for several hundred years, the Nursery has a modest stock of interesting and reasonably priced plants selected to survive in the drought and the rainy seasons recently seen in this area. In addition, we have a limited stock of mature plants from the Hillside Nursery of Albert J. (Bert) Shoosmith, our mentor, teacher, employer and friend in Chester, VA, who passed away in 2000.

Glossy abelia

Spreading rounded shrub with glossy dark leaves that sometimes tinge bronze. White 3/4" fragrant flowers from summer to frost. Compact new growth is copper, then yellow to pink. Pink/white flowers and bronze/rose fall color.

Glossy abelia

Festive pink, white and green foliage and white, showy flowers with no trace of pink. Withstands sun or partial shade and is an outstanding massing or ground cover.

Abelia x grandiflora 'Mardi Gras'

Glossy abelia

Variegated foliage, pink-white flowers, red-bronze stems, compact form, and low growing habit. Use as a foundation plant or in mass plantings. Range of coloration varies depending on amount of sun. Dark pink buds open to light pink flowers which fade to white.

Glossy abelia

White flowers throughout most of the year, tolerates wet (bog) conditions 24-30 inches high, evergreen in warmer zones, low mounding habit, crimson red stems, space 2.5 to 3 feet on center. This plant is attractive to bees, butterflies and/or birds. Flowers are fragrant. Average Water Needs; Water regularly; do not overwater This plant is resistant to deer. Provides winter interest.

A coarse shrub/small tree with rough, toothy leaves. A reclamation plant, particularly well suited for wet sites. It looks good in flower in the early spring.

Red chokeberry

'Brilliantissima' shows four seasons of interest with its lustrous, deep green leaves, small white flowers in the spring and clusters of large, red berries, and brilliant scarlet Fall color. Good border shrub, woodland garden plant. Use in moist areas.

Japanese aucuba

Densely upright-rounded to rounded shrub with a thicket of erect or arching shoots. Always a rather neat and tidy evergreen shrub.

Common boxwood

Purely columnar grower. Often used as an accent plant, to frame a doorway, especially in areas where little space is available. Plant in well drained areas. Does not do well in poorly drained soil. Extremely narrow upright form is great for upright accents in shade and will not fall open with age.

Japanese plum yew

An upright, deep green conifer for shade or sun, 'Fastigiata' will slowly grow to a final size of 30 feet, with a spread of 8 feet. It is a plant for the larger garden or property, and can be used to create a premium, slow-growing, deer proof hedge.

Slow growing, thick green foliage forms a pyramidal shape. Excellent plant for small landscapes and rock gardens. This majestic layered form of very dark green makes a stunning accent. Will perform well in sun or shade. The perfect miniature conifer for rock gardens, troughs, or container gardens.

An improved "hummingbird" with superior dense, mounded habit and larger blooms. Fragrant white flowers in mid-summer. Rich dark green foliage turns to yellow in the Fall. Full sun to light shade, adaptable to wet soils and shady locations. Accent, border or hedge plant.
